

**Alviso Storm Pump Improvements in San Jose, CA** - This project is a valuable use of taxpayer funds because it will complete design and construction for the Gold Street Pump Station improvements in the Alviso community, which is below sea level and is currently susceptible to sewer overflow flooding from storms that exceed the two-year return rate.

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**Christmas Hill Park-Uvas Creek Outfall Reconstruction in Gilroy, CA** - This project is a valuable use of taxpayer funds because it will repair erosion damage caused to the banks of Uvas Creek by recent excessive rainfall, which will protect the endangered Steelhead trout habitat and the City of Gilroy's park facilities from future rainstorms.
