**Saint Louise Regional Hospital New and Expanded Emergency Department:** This project is a valuable use of taxpayer funds because it will increase the capacity of Saint Louise Regional Hospital's Emergency Department from 8 to 21 beds. SLRH is a non-profit hospital and their Emergency Department treated 3,500 patients per bed in 2009, more than double the national average of 1,500 patients per bed. In its current configuration, close to 1,000 patients per year

leave without being treated due to lengthy wait times and limited space. Patients can wait up to 2.7 hours to see an emergency room physician. SLRH is the sole acute care hospital and emergency department within a 50 mile span, and visits to SLRH emergency department have increased by 73% in the past 10 years due to population growth and unemployment. SLRH is committed to serving the sick and the poor, regardless of their financial ability to pay and this new emergency department is necessary to address the community's needs.
